You'll find a powerful lineup of speakers, panels, and workshops designed to spark new thinking and give you practical tools you can take with you. Whether


you're here to grow your expertise, meet new people, or explore fresh perspectives, you're in the right place.

Biographies

Keynote



BG Michelle Letcher, USA (Ret)

CEO and Founder, Break Trail, LLC

Michelle leads executives and national security strategy priorities for complex

organizations that drive change across the enterprise and impact global security, human capital initiatives, quality of life, and modernization efforts at the intersection of defense, industry, and academia.

For over 27 years as an Army logistician, she led at all levels, from the tactical to the strategic and enterprise levels, leading soldiers in Iraq and Afghanistan, alongside our Allies and Partners in Europe and the Army, and within the Defense Organic Industrial Base.

Michelle recently published her first book. Additionally, she provides executive advice to national security focused small businesses, leads strategic planning support to the National Defense Industrial Association's Lone Star Chapter, lectures on decision-making and problemsolving at multiple academic institutions, and serves as a Senior Mentor to the North Atlantic Treaty Organization, focused on logistics and leadership.

As the Chief of Staff of the Army's most recent start-up, Army Futures Command, she managed the maturation of the acquisition and merger of over eighteen

organizations with an annual budget valued at \$12B in support of over 26K personnel to advance Army future force modernization and transformation efforts across defense, industry, and academia in support of our national security strategy.

As the Deputy Commanding General of the Combined Arms Support Command, she led the Joint Force's efforts to publish the Joint Warfighting Concept's Joint Concept for Contested Logistics. She led over 22 joint service executives globally to deliver a hypothesis that matured into a concept with required capabilities, including experimentation and resource investments, to deliver a future force capable of sustaining troops over vast distances, through contested domains, in a competitive space with increased sustainment demands through competition, crisis, and conflict. Simultaneously, she managed the professional development and career management programs and policies for 95K Soldiers globally across 40 areas of expertise in maintenance, munitions, and explosive ordnance disposal, with an annual training throughput of 180K Service members.

As the Commanding General of the Joint Munitions Command, she served as the chief executive officer for the life cycle management for all conventional munitions from development to production, storage,

security, fielding, and sustainment including global supply chain management and distribution. Her leadership included the operations and maintenance of fourteen plants, arsenals, depots, and activities across thirteen states to maintain and deliver the readiness of over \$57B worth of missiles and munitions in support of the Department of Defense.

She commanded a forward-stationed battalion and brigade in Europe alongside our Allies and Partners, with a presence in eighteen locations across eight countries. Following the Wales Summit, she enabled NATO's establishment of Force Integration Units by embedding U.S. leaders in shaping the security environment to deter aggression and assure the Alliance. Additionally, she led interoperability efforts across the alliance for sustainment capabilities in training and execution in competition.

Michelle holds a Bachelor of Arts in Social Work from Illinois State University, a Master of Science in Human Services and Counseling from SUNY Oswego, a Masters in Military Arts and Sciences from the Command and General Staff College, and a Master of Arts in National Security and Strategic Studies from Kansas State University. She began her Army career as a Second Lieutenant in the Air Defense Artillery.

Haley Britzky is a National Security reporter covering the Pentagon for CNN.

Britzky joined CNN in November 2022, where she tracks daily and long-term developments at the Department of Defense and reports on the Pentagon and military issues as a part of the national security team.

Previously, Britzky was the U.S. Army reporter at military news site Task & Purpose where she reported on military culture, policies, and everyday developments in the Army. Her reporting extensively covered how decisions made by senior leadership impact troops on the ground, military veterans, and their

families, everywhere from Fort Bragg, North Carolina, to Joint Base Pearl Harbor-Hickam, Hawaii, and beyond. Before Task & Purpose, she worked as a breaking news reporter at Axios.

Britzky is a Texan now living and working in Washington, D.C. She graduated from Texas Tech University with a degree in journalism.

The 67th Inspector General of the United States Army

LTG Donna W. Martin, from Yorktown, Virginia, is a proud graduate of Old Dominion University.

She was commissioned into the Military Police Corps in 1988 and holds a master's degree in strategic studies from the U.S. Army War College. Throughout her career,

LTG Martin served in various command and staff roles, including commanding at the brigade level twice. LTG Martin has several notable achievements in her 36-year career; she was the first female to command the Maneuver Support Center of Excellence and Fort Leonard Wood from 2018 – 2020. She was the first woman of color to serve as the Commanding

General of the Criminal Investigations Command and held dual responsibilities as the Provost Marshal General of the Army. In 2021, she became the only woman to hold her last position in the Army as the Inspector General of the U.S. Army. LTG Martin is married to Col Chris Martin, USMC (Ret), and they have one son, Christopher and two puppies: Frankie & Gracie.

Col Pamela Powers, USAF (Ret)

Pamela Powers is a distinguished leader and retired Colonel with over two decades

of experience in both the military and corporate sectors, and was selected as one of the 2019 Top 100 most impactful Veterans and supporters by the Hill Vets Organization. Her career spans roles in the Air Force, U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs, and consulting services leading federal transformation initiatives.

Most recently, she served as the Managing Director for Federal Transformation Delivery at KPMG for DoD agency accounts with a team of 200+ professionals. Prior to that, she was the Acting U.S. Deputy Secretary of Veterans Affairs, where she

spearheaded enterprise modernization for the federal government's secondlargest Cabinet department.

Her senior roles at the Pentagon included serving as Chief of Staff to the Under Secretary of Defense for Personnel and Readiness, where she focused on Total Force Management.



Dr. Theresa Watson

Dr. Theresa E. Watson serves as the Chief Operating Officer at Kegman Inc, an employee-

owned small business headquartered in Melbourne, Florida. Kegman delivers world-class, on-site science, technology, and engineering expertise in support of National Security, warfighter, space launch, and earthquake monitoring missions—advancing DoD priorities, policy development, and scientific discovery. She holds a PhD in Chemistry and has dedicated her career to advancing global security, delivering operational results for the warfighter, and empowering underrepresented groups in STEM through science and mentorship.

As Kegman COO, Dr. Watson leads daily operations, strategic planning, and organizational growth, aligning technical capabilities with evolving government mission needs. She drives innovation, builds cross-sector partnerships, and ensures delivery of agile, cost-effective,

and impactful solutions across the RDT&E and operational landscape.

Dr. Watson is a nationally recognized expert in nonproliferation, emerging weapons, signature analytics, space science, and intelligence integration. She serves as a scientific leader and review board member for Los Alamos National Laboratory, guiding strategic investment and high-impact research supporting national security, deterrence, space domain awareness and exploration, energy resilience, border security, and health security.

Prior to joining Kegman, Dr. Watson served as the Deputy Chief Scientist of the Air Force Technical Applications Center, where she supported 24/7 nuclear monitoring, WMD detection, and operations for the DoD's largest sensor network. She led a strategic posture review, authored the AFTAC Strategy, and co-authored a national Nuclear Enterprise Review defining long-term direction and shaping future defense collection strategies across 18 agencies. She routinely briefed

WMD assessments and technology development to senior leaders, including the White House, Congress, and National Security Council—translating complex science into decision advantage.

Dr. Watson served on a separate Joint Duty assignment at the Defense Intelligence Agency, where she chaired a national R&D Subcommittee.
